


# Newsletter – Issue 3 December 2012

Welcome to the Friends of York Walls newsletter. It is now a year since our last newsletter, so this new issue is long overdue. For those of you who are new readers - The Friends of York Walls (FOYW) is a voluntary non-profit making group. The group aims to help promote manage and develop York's Walls and Defences (including the Bar Walls, St Mary's Abbey, Clifford's Tower and The Castle) for the benefit of local residents and visitors. We organise and undertake practical work and organise public events in co-operation with the City of York Council and other like-minded groups or individuals. We seek to establish York Walls as a major worldwide attraction, one that the residents of York can take pride in, and residents and visitors can enjoy to the full.

The Friends of York Walls have no income other than from donations and fund raising activities. We have no actual assets as the York Walls are in the care of and maintained by the City of York Council (CYC). CYC are fully supportive of our aims and objectives and are helping us to achieve these. We have formed a UK Charity the 'York Walls Charitable Trust' to administer out activities. We have an ongoing major fund raising activity to re-open one of the disused towers along the York Walls.

The Friends of York Walls have organised a number of events over the past year and have helped to establish new traditions and activities on and around the walls. We continue in our efforts to reopen Fishergate Postern Tower and are still actively seeking funding to achieve this aim. We have achieved quite a lot in 2012. Our activities have been featured on our website, Facebook and Twitter, and sometimes in the local press and local on-line magazines. #### **Fishergate Postern Tower**

One of the biggest ongoing objectives of the Friends of York Walls is to re-open Fishergate Postern Tower for community use. FOYW have the full support of City of York Council in this venture and negotiations for the use of the tower for community use are still progressing. FOYW are working in close partnership with CYC, English Heritage and others to bring Fishergate Postern Tower into community use.



The tower was built between 1504 and 1507 in place of an earlier structure known as Talken Tower - after Robert de-Talken who was a Lord Mayor of York. The tower is situated at the end of Piccadilly, opposite the Weatherspoon's "The Postern Gate" on the corner of Fishergate and Piccadilly. It has 4 stories, which are linked by a narrow spiral staircase. The tiled roof was added in 1740. It was last used as an Artists studio.

Major funding is still being sought to refurbish the 500 year old tower and give it a new lease of life as a visitor

centre and small cafe. The City of York Council has been asked to provide funding to complete repair work, which is essential for any funding bids. CYC have allocated £20,000 from their capital contingency fund to help carry out repair work to the tower. At the present time we are still waiting for this work to be scheduled.

The first Fishergate Postern Tower "Public Open Days" took place on Saturday 28th & Sunday 29th January 2012, as part of the York Residents Festival Weekend. Visitors enjoyed a free talk and an inspection tour including a brief history of the tower before hearing about the plans for its development. This was probably the first time the tower had seen so many visitors for hundreds of years!

During the June to September summer months the tower was opened at weekends by a dedicated and enthusiastic team of volunteers. Visitors to the tower were given a conducted tour and a brief history talk. We thank all our volunteers who helped to support the summer opening of the tower and hope to achieve even more opening hours during the 2013 season.

# Fishergate Postern Tower – "Sponsor a Stone"

Friends of York Walls are continuing to work towards the refurbishment and ultimate re-opening of Fishergate Postern Tower. One of the ways we are seeking to raise funds towards this project is by inviting the general public and local businesses to "Sponsor a Stone". This major fund raising activity was officially launched on Tuesday 17th January 2012 when The Lord Mayor of York, Councilor David Horton, patron of the Friends of York Walls, was presented with a certificate of ownership of the first stone at Fishergate Postern Tower from Friends chairman Keith Myers and watched by fellow friends.

Over the year 200 stones have been sponsored and this has raised over £4,600 from the Sponsor a Stone initiative! We would like to thank each and every one of our donors to date, along with all those people who have made a standard donation.

If you wish to contribute then please look at the website <u>Sponsor</u> a <u>Stone page</u> where you can fill in an online application form, follow the links to view the current state of the <u>Sponsored Stones</u> <u>grid</u> or read entries in the online <u>Sponsors Book</u>.



For your sponsorship you can choose a specific and identifiable external stone, or stones, on an outside face of Fishergate Postern Tower, York, UK. You will be issued with a certificate to record your stones label and your donation. Stone locations and their availability are identified on the web page on the <a href="Sponsored Stones grid">Sponsored Stones grid</a>. Stones are allocated according to availability and only issued once. Sponsors names, together with an optional messages, can be entered into a "Book of Sponsors" which can be viewed on the website and will eventually be on display within the tower itself.

This is a unique opportunity to contribute towards a project to restore one of York's ancient monuments to public use. By sponsoring a stone or stones you contribute towards the Fishergate Postern Tower restoration work. Your sponsorship can be for yourself, is ideal as a gift for someone, or for a significant event or person in your life. The scheme can be used to observe a special occasion such as a birthday, a christening, a wedding, as a memorial or simply to convey a message.

Sponsorship is also being sought from local Businesses and Corporations whose names will be recorded in a "Book of Business Sponsors" and also credited in suitable Friends of York Walls literature, and eventually in a tower display. We are also looking for business sponsors for our FOYW printed material.

# 100<sup>th</sup> Stone Presentation and "Thank You" to Mayor David Horton

In one of his last official duties of 2012, the outgoing Lord Mayor of York, Councilor David Horton, presented a commemorative certificate to Philip Noble to celebrate the sponsoring of the 100th stone of Fishergate Postern Tower. An afternoon tea and a tour of the Mansion House accompanied this event. Councilor Horton was thanked for all he had done as the patron of The Friends of York Walls in his year in office.



# Walks, Talks and Tours



In November 2011 English Heritage had announced that Clifford's Tower would be closed on weekdays during the winter season. In response the Friends of York Walls negotiated to provide limited weekday openings. For the 2012 winter season FOYW volunteers provided guided tours of Clifford's Tower on Wednesdays and Thursdays.

Throughout the year the Friends of York Walls have continued to provide visiting groups with walks, talks and tours. On 1<sup>st</sup> August we met up with the 'Yorkshire Ridings Society' when they read 'Proclamations' at each of the bars in York as part of the Declaration of Yorkshire Integrity. This is an annual event and ending up in Parliament Street. In early September a visiting walking group from Cumbria were given an afternoon guided tour of the walls and visited the inside of Fishergate Postern Tower.

The Bars and Walls of York are the finest and most complete of any town in England. At two miles the walls are the longest in the UK and are one of York's top free visitor attractions. Over a million people take a walk through 1900 years of history on York's city walls. Built in Roman times, they have been added to and rebuilt over time and now have parts from across the centuries.

As you walk the walls and look at the bars would you like to know more about their history and the changes that have taken place over the centuries? The Friends of York Walls can provide walking guides for small or

larger groups, as well as talks and presentations to individuals or groups.

A "walls walk" around the full circuit will take approximately two hours with just a few stops for talking. However a more comprehensive "walk and talk" can take considerably longer depending on the number of stops and the requirements of the group.



#### The Lord Mayors Inspection in March

About forty children from Copmanthorpe Primary School called on the Lord Mayor on Monday 12th March and ask him to 'Inspect the Walls'. The event was first held in March 2011 and it returned this year with a slightly different timetable.

The children escorted the Mayor and Civic Party to Bootham Bar. The Civic Party then walked onto the Walls to inspect them. The Mayor was presented with a scroll at 'Robin Hood Tower' by Keith Myers, Chairman of Friends of York Walls who thanked him for being their Patron. The Civic Party alighted from the Walls at Monk Bar and walked up Lord Mayors Walk, which was lined with 300 local school children who waved



daffodils that they had made. The Mayor presented a scroll of thanks to each of the children from Copmanthorpe School who had escorted him back to the Mansion House.

# The Queens Visit to York – Maundy Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> April



Her Majesty The Queen was given the time-honored Monarch's welcome to the City of York at Micklegate Bar, in a medieval atmosphere conjured up by traditional musicians and musketeers. She met the Lord Mayor David Horton and the town clerk, Kersten England, who read out a proclamation of welcome.

The Friends of York Walls "awarded" HM Queen Elizabeth her own FPT stone (45K) to commemorate her visit to York on Thursday April 5th 2012. The Queen was visiting York as part of the 800th Anniversary of achieving City status and to distribute the Maundy Money at the Minster.

# **St Georges Day Parade**

Friends of York Walls and others staged a costumed parade on St. George's Day on Monday 23rd April 2012. St George and the Dragon set off from Fishergate Postern Tower at 6pm and walked to the Eye of York, via Clifford's Tower. At the Eye of York the Dragon was fatally wounded, and a Marauding Scotsman was captured. The parade then returned to Fishergate Postern Tower where the wounded dragon was caged. This has become an annual event which we hope to perform each year.



# Olympic Torch Relay – June



The Olympic torch visited York's famous historic walls, as part of the 2012 London Olympics build up, on day 31 of the Olympic Torch Trail on the leg from Hull to York. The torch was taken onto the walls from Micklegate Bar to Lendal Bridge and then through the streets of York and on to The Racecourse for the evening celebration.

# Lord Mayor's entertainment and "walls walk" – 14th July 2012



On Saturday 14th July 2012 The Friends of York Walls escorted the Lord Mayor of York Councilor Keith Hyman, and Mrs Karen Hyman the Lady Mayoress, on a walk along some of York's historic walls. The civic party was first entertained by the York Concert Band on the front lawns of The Kings Mansion before setting off on a "walls walk" through the Museum Gardens to Lendal Bridge and the start of the city walls. There they were entertained by a busker and given tea and biscuits courtesy of the Cedar Court Hotel. More buskers entertained the walking party at Micklegate Bar and then at the Bitchdaughter Tower where the party was given wine and biscuits. The walls walk finished at Fishergate Postern Tower when the civic party sponsored a stone

and climbed the spiral staircase to view the upper floors. Throughout the event collections were taken in aid of "The Lord Mayors Charities". The money raised (£130.00) went to the SAFA charity, one of the Lord Mayors charities.

#### Tofts Fair - 21st July



On Saturday 21st July the Friends of York Walls held a Tofts Fair around Lower Priory Street, just inside the walls near to the Victoria Bar. With help from the local Residents Association and the support of the City of York Council, this was part of the City's 800th Charter Year celebrations. #### **Information Stalls and Fairs**

At the Dragon Boat Races on Saturday 22nd September the Friends of York Walls had an "information and sponsor-a-stone" stall along The Dame Judi Dench Walk next to the River Ouse. The annual Dragon Boat Races organised by the York Rotary had been postponed from earlier in the year due to high river levels.

FOYW also had information stalls at many other events during the year including Tesco Askham Bar, a "volunteering open day" for new students at York University, and at the 'Visit York' event at The Racecourse.



#### York Walls – A Chinese MA post-graduate's viewpoint

### FOYW Visited Chester – Tuesday 16th Oct 2012

A group from The Friends of York Walls had a wonderful day out on a visit to the walled city

of Chester on Tuesday October 16th 2012. FOYW have formed links with some members of the Chester Renaissance Group and a day visit to Chester was organised with their help. They entertained us with a guided walk & talk around the walls, including entry into many places the normal public currently don't have access to.

The coach departed from York at 9.30am and after a wet drive via the M62 the sun came out and we arrived at Chester in time for lunch and a short look around the city center.

Chester Renaissance have recently been spending over

£2M on major restoration work around their City Walls and have included many innovative improvements to make the walls a major tourist attraction. The result of the work should be an inspiration for York and to FOYW – if only we could get some of the same European Grant money!

We walked the walls in an anticlockwise direction and looked in many of the restored towers not presently open to the public.

We would like to thank Jane Hebblewhite and Magnus Theobald of Chester Renaissance for their time, their interesting talks and their guidance during a wonderful afternoon, and for giving us the opportunity to see the results of all the recent work on the Chester City Walls.


